PETER STUART

- Mr. Stuart moved to Riverview in 1981, where he founded and served as Head Coach of the Moncton McDonald's Track and Field Club (1981-1986). The club has had numerous name changes over the years, including Riverview Track and Field Club (1986-1989), South-East Athletics (SEA, 1989-2007) and Athletisme Sud-Est/South-East Athletics (ASEA, 2007-present).
- Played a pivotal role in the development of the Royal Canadian Legion New Brunswick Command Track and Field program, serving youth since 1979.
- Coached track and field and cross country running at Riverview Middle School (1986-2012), leading his teams to 41 District Championships. Coached at Riverview High School (1997-2006), capturing back-to-back NBIAA Championships in Track and Field (1997, 1998).
- Organized the Anglophone East School District track and field meet (2012-present) and cross country running championships (1981-2011), growing the sport from 25 athletes representing three schools to 18 schools representing over 500 athletes.
- Directed over 250 cross country and road-race competitions in the Greater Moncton area, including the National Track League (2011, 2012), Canadian Track and Field Championships (2013, 2014), and National Track and Field Tour (2023).
- Developed the new provincial Trail Blazers program (2022), introducing hundreds of young athletes ages 6-11 across New Brunswick to the sport of athletics.
- Three-time elected Coach of the Year by Athletics New Brunswick (1995, 2015, 2018), and Volunteer of the Year by Athletics NB (2011).
- Honoured by Sport New Brunswick with the Lifetime Volunteer Achievement Award (2010-2011), and by Coach New Brunswick with the Coaches Excellence Award (2013).
- Inducted to the Moncton Sports Wall of Fame (2023).



- Coached Riverview athletes Stephany Reid (Riverview Sports Wall of Fame, Class of 2023) and Mike LeBlanc (fastest man in NB history).
- Coached Laura Dickinson to a gold medal for Team Canada in the U20 Pan American Athletics Championships in Trujillo, Peru (2017).
- Coaching over four decades, he has worked with thousands of athletes ages 6-90, over 150 national medalists, 12 Canadian National Team Members (representing all four event groups sprints, endurance, jumps and throws) and 5 International Medalists.
