HOW TO SAVE SEEDS

1. SELECT AN HEIRLOOM OR OPEN-POLLINATED VARIETY

 Plants grown from "hybrid" or GMO seeds may not produce seeds or may not produce seeds of the same variety from which they were grown



2. SELECT THE BEST

 Select individuals from your crop that display the best traits of that variety (large, healthy, vigorous plants)

ISOLATE THE SEEDS

 Take steps to ensure that your crop doesn't cross-pollinate with other varieties. Check out SeedSavers.org for specific information for each plant species.



HARVEST THE SEEDS

 Collect seeds from mature produce, some seeds may need to be fermented or washed before storing

DRY THE SEEDS

 make sure seeds are fully dry before storing to prevent spoilage



WINNOW SEEDS

 separate seeds from hulls, pods, or vegetable flesh by "winnowing"
Either passing back and forth through an air current or using water



LABLE AND STORE SEEDS

 Label seeds with species, variety, and year saved. Store in glass jars or envelopes in a rigid container to prevent breakage. Seeds should be kept somewhere cool and dry and away from direct light.
