VEGETABLES

PLANT: ARTICHOKE

VARIETY: GREEN GLOBE

TYPE:

STATUS: HEIRLOOM



DESCRIPTION:

Green buds with a slight bit of purple. Best harvested when 5-9 cm (2.5-4 inches) in diameter. Plants reach 1.5m (4.5') high. Best grown in containers or greenhouses to allow plants to survive the winter in Canada. The plants can also be dug up when dormant and relocated to an indoor location for the winter. Even though an artichoke plant can give a harvest on the first year, it is actually the second and third year where these produce the best.

DESCRIPTION:

Viking Asparagus is one of the hardiest and most productive asparagus varieties. Although it takes a few years for a full harvest, the mature dark green stalks are deliciously flavorful and well worth the wait. Asparagus is a great source of essential vitamins and minerals, making it a nutritious addition to any meal.

DESCRIPTION:

A heritage variety grown since the late 1940s, Mary Washington asparagus produces a vigorous, disease-resistant plant. Perennial plant with fine, wispy foliage about 1-1.5 meters tall. Allow 3 years before the first asparagus harvest; the plant will then produce for the next 15 to 20 years.

DESCRIPTION:

Bigger beans, bigger flavor. The winner for taste in Burpee's bean play-offs. You'll be astonished at Big Kahunas' crisp, nutty flavor, giant 11" pods, and unstoppable productivity. Compact 2 foot tall plants work wonders in small-space gardens and containers.

DESCRIPTION:

This beautiful pole bean takes its name from the Canadian gardener who brought it from Russia to southern Manitoba, where it has been maintained since. Vigorous, fast-growing vines produce a prolific set of large, plump, stunning half cream/half burgundy beans. Very early and excellent as a baking bean. Similar markings to our Calypso, but burgundy instead of black.

DESCRIPTION:

Bird Egg Blue Bush Bean (*Phaseolus vulgaris*) This heirloom is a one of the most flavourful snap beans we have grown. Pods contain 6 round blue-purple coloured egg shaped beans. Pods are smooth, easily digested, and remain edible for a long picking window. When allowed to dry, they are fantastic in soups or mashed.

DESCRIPTION:



Black Turtle Bean is an old heirloom variety that was introduced in the late 1700's. Dry pods have beautiful, vivid jet black plump seeds. The bush variety bean are heat resistant, and have a good disease tolerance. Plants can grow between 45-51 cm (18-24") tall and have an average spread between 30-40 cm (12-16"). Typically they are grown to harvest the dry beans that are used in black bean soup. Matures in 90-100 days.

DESCRIPTION:



Blue Lake pole beans are straight, stringless and unusually smooth, with a stronger flavour than the bush variety. Plants bear lots of dark green (6-7") pods that are round to oval, tender, and meaty. Blue Lake has a very long harvest window and will keep producing new pods as long as the vines are kept picked. Provide a pole or trellis for this tall vine to grow up. This variety is hugely popular for its productivity in the Prairies and other short season growing regions.

DESCRIPTION:

In 1898 Abel Steele of Ferguson, Ontario won a \$25.00 prize for naming this new variety from Peter Henderson & Company, previously known as "New Green Bush Bean No. 1." Heavy crops of excellent quality, brittle, stringless 6-7" pods. Productive plants grow up to 18" tall.

DESCRIPTION:



Carson bush bean is a high yielding yellow wax bean that produces early yellow wax bean that are 13 cm (5¼") long. Pods are slender straight yellow pods that hang in clusters on strong compact dark green bushy plants. Average plant height is 30-70 cm (13-28") with a spread that is 38-51 cm (15-18") wide. They are easy to grow, easy to harvest and easy to see among the green foliage. Very good flavor and texture. Good storage and fine freezing potential. These beans are tender and string-less.

DESCRIPTION:

An extremely rare Mohawk bean from the Tyendinaga Reserve in Ontario, Canada. The natives used this type of bean as a thickener in soup and the beans are soft enough to be mashed like potatoes. The plants are a vigorously twining bush but can be grown on a fence as a pole bean as well

Desperado is a robust variety that produces high yields of high-quality straight pods, quick to mature. Well adapted for heat and stress tolerance with strong consumer appeal. 53 days

DESCRIPTION:

Glorious flavour and crisp texture make Gold Rush bush bean seeds a great choice for pickling and freezing. The beans are bright yellow with green tips. They are borne in clusters around the stem which makes them easy to pick. The stringless pods are perfect at 10-12cm (4-5") long. The medium sized bush plants are resistant to BCMV and tolerant of root rot. Wax beans have a pleasant, mild flavour and make a lovely change from regular green beans.

DESCRIPTION:



Good Mother Stallard Pole Bean (*Phaseolus vulgaris*) An outstanding heirloom pole bean dating back to the 1930's, named after Carrie Belle Stallard of Wise County, Virginia. These beans remind one of old maroon coloured glass marbles splashed with white streaks. Plump pods have 5-6 seeds. These are a meaty bean with a rich nutty, fruity flavour, making them great in soups. They are also splendid as a shell bean. Plants require some support with their pole habit.

DESCRIPTION:



A true Acadian legend! In 1755, Acadians deported from the Bay of Fundy purposely grounded their ships along the shores of Clare County. Survivors hid deep in the woods, living with the Mi'kmaw, lost to the ruling British. Acadians found this bean in the gullet of a downed goose that fall, then saved and planted the seed the next spring. It has been grown by locals ever since. 6-7 seeds/pod, easy to shell and sweet.

DESCRIPTION:



(aka Burpee's Stringless Green Pod) In 1894 Calvin Keeney who was known as the "Father of the Stringless Bean" developed Burpee's Stringless Green Pod which was then introduced by the Burpee Seed Company. It remained the most popular bean for years and was claimed to be the first stringless bean. An excellent snap bean with 5" pods and brown seed. Early, productive and tasty. One of the best!

DESCRIPTION:



The precise origins of this beautiful, ancient heirloom bean are not known. The plump, oblong beans are creamy white, and speckled with deep burgundy. The markings darken to almost coffee brown as the seeds age. During the summer, Jacob's Cattle Bean makes quite a nice snap bean, before the seeds mature. The tasty beans cook in about half the time as other dry beans.

DESCRIPTION:

A wonderful rare heirloom pole bean that is productive and disease resistant. The green pods can be eaten when young as a snap bean and when mature, the beautiful oval tan seed with brown streaks can be eaten as a dry bean. Extremely productive!

DESCRIPTION:



Kentucky Wonder) Pole Bean (*Phaseolus vulgaris*) First introduced around 1864 in Kentucky, this heirloom is an old time favourite, also known as Kentucky Wonder. This pole bean is well known for its flavourful seven inch long, round, stringless pods. Productive vines are high yielding of tender beans that can be used fresh, shelled, and dried. Easy to grow and manage...you supply a trellis opportunity and away it goes!

Kitchen King beans are easy to grow and container friendly! This bush bean variety produces an abundance of dark green pods that attract bees to your garden.

Sow seeds in spring for an early summer harvest and enjoy tender snap beans by mid-June or July. Each garden bean measures 4-5 inches. Best eaten steamed or stir-fried.

Their bold appearance makes them a favourite for gardeners young and old, and they're a perfect conversation starter in any garden plot.

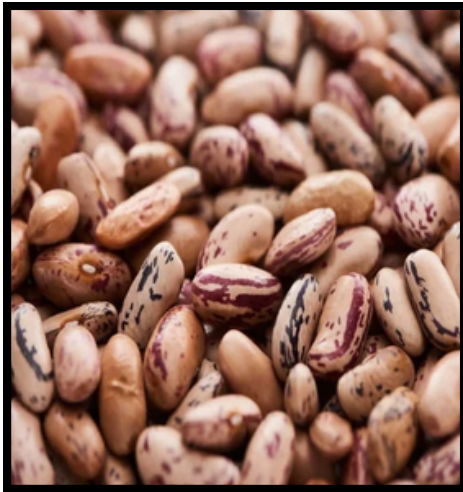

STATUS: OPEN POLLINATED

DESCRIPTION:



Native to Mexico, pintos take about 90-150 days to grow as a dry shell bean but can be harvested earlier and eaten as a green snap bean. They can tolerate being dried out while growing, making them easy beans to grow. The traditional way to grow pinto beans is with corn as a companion plant. The corn stalks provide trellises for the pinto bean vines to climb, and the pinto beans adjust the nitrogen in the soil to benefit the corn. The pinto bean is most prominent in Mexican cuisine and is often used for refried beans.

DESCRIPTION:

50 days. Heirloom Bush Bean, 1965. Provider holds true to its name! This incredibly early, dependable bush bean will feed your family AND your neighborhood! The beans themselves are about 5 inches long. The seeds, as you will note, are like little mahogany gems.

Sow 8-10 cm apart, outdoors when all risk of frost has passed.

Heirloom seeds are reproducible. You can preserve them and share them around you.

DESCRIPTION:

Romano is a gourmet bean with a distinctive flavor. Wide, flat, 12.5-15 cm (5-6") pods grow in abundance on 38-50 cm (15-20") tall plants. The stringless bush beans are very meaty when mature, and an excellent freezer variety. These tender beans are also perfect for soups, stews, or a side dish.

DESCRIPTION:

Royal Burgundy produces an unusual dark purple podded bean, though pods turn dark green when cooked. Enjoy an abundant yield of tender and delicious stringless beans. These beans are excellent when used either fresh or frozen.

DESCRIPTION:

Striking scarlet flowers attract hummingbirds. Beans are delicious when young and tender. Rapid and tall climbers. Doubles as an ornamental. Seed from a small organic farm in British Columbia.

DESCRIPTION:

A longtime favorite, this bean's round pods are on average, 15cm (6") long, straight and nearly stringless. Yield is heavy and prolonged. Bush type habit growing 50-70cm (20-28") tall with spread of 51-61cm (20-24") wide. The flavor and texture are excellent, particularly when picked at a modest size. Equally good for freezing or eating fresh.

DESCRIPTION:

First released in 1950 in Beltsville, Maryland, this heirloom is considered one of the best bush beans for canning and freezing or eating fresh from the garden. Topcrop bean get its name from consistently producing high yields of concentrated 6-7-inch stringless pods that develop near the top of the plants, making them very easy to harvest. This variety has particularly rapid seed development, so it is better to harvest the small crispy beans on the early side.

DESCRIPTION:

Translated from Italian, this bean's name means "purple triumph", and this Italian heirloom will surely win you over! This treasure is a crisp, flavorful treat & highly ornamental. Abundant lavender flowers bloom against lush green foliage with a hint of burgundy that almost seems to be applied with a water-color brush. All of this accented against slender, dark stems, and long, thin, purple beans that are delicious fresh off the vine! It is so pretty you may want to grow it even if you don't eat a single bean! Stunning, prolific, and delicious!

DESCRIPTION:

Vermont Cranberry Bush Bean (*Phaseolus vulgaris*) An heirloom of New England origins dating back to the 1780's. Vermont Cranberry's pods contain 5 to 6 speckled cranberry-coloured shell beans. Reliable, hardy, easy to shell. This plant survived hurricane Dorian. A great shell or dry bean with exceptional flavour.

DESCRIPTION:

Small seed which is white with grayish green speckles and orange around the hilum. Great for baking or soup. Quite productive plants with short runners. A very early and disease resistant bush plant. A very old variety. Endangered

DESCRIPTION:

This large variety will fix nitrogen in your soil, so it's perfect for planting in the fall, harvesting in the spring, and following with nitrogen loving crops like Brassicas, lettuce, or spinach. Fresh or dried, broad beans must be cooked before eating in order to rid them of potentially toxic alkaloids. The young, tender leaves can be eaten raw, or cooked like spinach

VARIETY: CYLINDRA

STATUS: HEIRLOOM



DESCRIPTION:

Cylindra beet seeds are a very sweet heirloom first introduced to the US from Europe in 1892. Its cylindrical shape makes it very nice for pickling or slicing. The leaves of this beet are a little sweeter than most other beets, and are very nice as salad greens. Roots grow to 20cm (8") long, with dark red flesh. Nearly two thirds of the length of the root will grow above ground, so some gardeners like to hill up soil around each plant as the root emerges. This will keep the skins of the root very tender and protect them from insects. Cylindra beet seeds also happen to produce particularly nice micro-greens.

DESCRIPTION:

Detroit Dark Red is the perfect all-purpose beet variety. This medium-early variety produces round, dark red roots. These beets are very enjoyable, growing tender and fine-grained throughout. Ideal for use fresh, canned, pickled and frozen. Tops are great for salads too!

DESCRIPTION:



This improved Detroit Medium Top is known for its deep red roots with smooth skin and medium tops. The tasty, nutritious leaves are dark green with red veins and a small crown. Detroit Supreme was bred to be mildew resistant for either processing or fresh market production. Because the roots are so uniform and dark, they look fabulous bunched for the market table. They are particularly nice for pickling, as the brine will turn a very dark red claret colour, and they stay tender but crunchy.

DESCRIPTION:

Early Wonder Tall Top beet seeds beets adapt to all seasons but are especially good in early spring with quick growth in chilly soils. They produce tall, tasty green leaves with red stems and slightly flattened roots with wonderfully sweet flavour. Early Wonder Tall Top beets makes a good variety for general table use. Grow as micro-greens or baby leaf greens for salad mixes, or enjoy the sweet round roots at full size. Be sure to thin the planted row to allow each root the room it needs to grow to full size.

DESCRIPTION:

Golden Detroit Beets are sweet and tender with round, orange roots and golden flesh. This variety will stay golden yellow when cooked and won't bleed. Tops are deep, glossy green. Roots grow fast, but retain their sweet flavor even when quite large. Excellent for pickles.

STATUS: OPEN POLLINATED



DESCRIPTION:

Green top bunching beets are famous for their tall edible tops, which are perfect for salads and cooking. Produces flattened globe-shaped, deep red roots for cooking or pickling.

VARIETY: RUBY QUEEN

STATUS: HEIRLOOM



DESCRIPTION:

Ruby Queen beets are bright red with short tops. The semi-globe roots have a sweet, buttery texture. For best flavor, harvest when the root's diameter is 4-5 cm (1 1/2-2"). Roots may be used fresh, diced, canned, pickled or frozen. 55 days to harvest

PLANT: BROCCOLI

VARIETY: DE CICCIO

STATUS: HEIRLOOM



DESCRIPTION:

An Italian multi-cut broccoli that produces a small main head followed by an abundance of tender sideshoots. Cut Di Ciccio's 8-10cm (3-4") blue-green, central head to induce the production of sideshoots and keep them cut to extend the harvest. Best for spring and fall production, the initial head will be looser than standard heading types and with more variation of floret size than other sprouting varieties. Excellent fresh, and a very good choice for freezing. Di Ciccio can also be used for a fast microgreen. This is an old European heirloom that has been in cultivation since 1890.

DESCRIPTION:

This reliable Italian variety is very disease-resistant, hardy and prolific. These easy-to-grow plants can grow up to 75-90 cm (30-36") tall producing bluish-green heads that measure 12.5 cm (5") across. Once the head is harvested, the plant produces many side shoots. Enjoy the flavor and health benefits of this superfood.

DESCRIPTION:

This superior heat-loving broccoli produces 15-20 cm (6-8") tight dome-shaped heads with attractive, small dark green beads. The heads have an excellent shelf-life post harvest. This multi-use broccoli is great for fresh eating or freezing.

DESCRIPTION:

Romanesco broccoli has been a culinary delight since the 1500s and its origins can be traced back to northern Italy. It is considered a broccoli, but is really somewhere between broccoli and cauliflower. Others say it is part psychedelic broccoli and part alien life form. Another impressive variation member of the brassica family, Romanesco broccoli has a unique tasty flavour and some obvious ornamental qualities that make it quite attractive in the garden.

DESCRIPTION:

Attractive blue-green heads sit ready to harvest through the heat and sweeten more when kissed by fall frosts. Well leaved plants yield these 6-8" diameter heads and 5-10 1" side shoots as well. GARDEN HINTS: For earlier harvest, sow seeds indoors in a sunny spot or under plant lights 6 to 8 weeks before outdoor planting date- this works for both the spring and fall! If purchasing plants in the fall, plant upon arrival and harvest before heavy frost hits. Avoid planting in garden area where cabbage family was grown the year before. Withstands light frost.

DESCRIPTION:

Matures very quickly from seed. Green shoots have a captivating flavor. Cut 6" pieces when they are the size of a quarter. You'll love it lightly sauteed with garlic and olive oil, fresh in salads and boiled soups.

VARIETY: CATSKILL

DESCRIPTION:

This heirloom was introduced in 1941 in Arkport, New York and has remained a popular choice over the years. This vigorous dwarf variety produces an abundance of large sprouts that are considered tastier than the hybrid varieties. One of the best garden varieties for a sustained production, the stalks are very sturdy, making them quite easy to pick. The sprouts will have a sweeter flavour after a few fall frosts, and they can be harvested even if they're under an inch of snow. 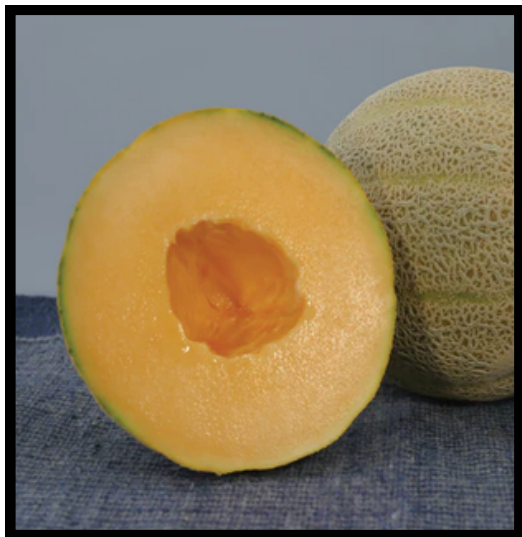

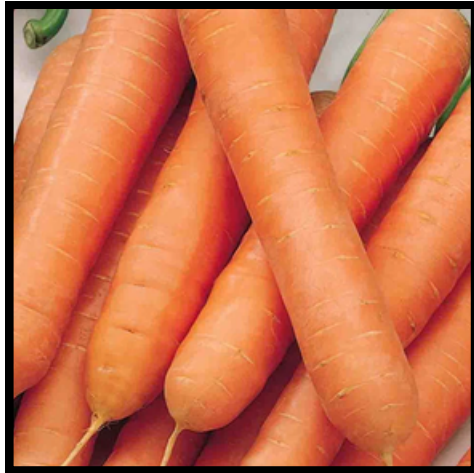
