

Council Highlights Regular Council Meeting – September 14, 2015

Ca-R-Ma Cat Rescue Maritimes

Council discussed options regarding the service provided by Ca-R-Ma Cat Rescue Maritimes, a non-profit organization that works to humanely reduce feral cat populations in our community. Council made a motion to continue to use the Trap-Neuter-Return program offered by CARMA in the Warren Avenue area, where residents have brought forward concerns about a growing population of feral cats. If the issue is not solved within a six month period, it will return to Council for further action.

Right to Information and Protection of Privacy Act

CAO Colin Smith was appointed to be the head of the public body, as required by the Right to Information and Protection of Privacy Act.

416 Pine Glen Road

Council made a motion to prescribe standard for a 1.5 metre screening fence along the northern boundary of a non-conforming property located at 416 Pine Glen Road.

Road repairs on Route 114

Director of Engineering and Public Works Michel Ouellet shared with Council correspondence from the Province of New Brunswick indicating that the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure will perform repairs and paving on Route 114 (Coverdale Road). The work is scheduled to start on Monday, September 21 and last for 5 days. The public will be notified via communication from DTI and the Town of Riverview.

Codiac Transpo Survey

CAO Colin Smith updated Council on the community engagement process regarding the proposed changes to the Codiac Transpo bus routes in Riverview. To date, 250 responses have been received from riders and non-riders. Residents can take the survey at www.townofriverview.ca/transit until Sept. 23. Staff will compile and analyze feedback for a report to Council before the 2016 budget deliberations.
