- Council accepted the three-year Marketing and Communications Strategy as presented.
- Council accepted the recommendation from the Community Wellness Centre Committee to award the Request for Quote for Fundraising Proposal Requirements (Wellness Centre) to BNP Philantropic Performance in the amount of \$25,000 plus HST
- Council approved the purchase of 1.08 acres (a portion of PID # 00649046) to maintain the
 Town's existing park space at the site of the former Gunningsville School. The Province
 plans to sell the land as surplus since the school was closed. The Town maintains a
 basketball and tennis court at this location. Cost: \$23,450 plus HST, survey, legal fees and
 transfer tax.
