

- Born in Moncton, Brian moved to Riverview in the 1960s where he became an athlete in many community recreational activities including baseball, hockey, football, and softball.
- Founder of the men's Riverview Fastball League, serving as President from 1972-1973.
- Volunteered his time and expertise with the New Brunswick Softball Association in various capacities in the late 1990s, including coordinating the minor softball program in Region 5 (1997-1998).
- Volunteered in many coaching roles, elevating the game and skills of Riverview players: Head Coach of Riverview A's Peewee Girls softball competitive team (1995-1997). This team advanced to the national playoffs in Laval, Quebec (1997).
- · Head Coach of the Moncton Rebels Bantam Girls softball team, with youth representation from Westmorland, Albert, and Kent Counties.
- Founded and was the head instructor of a regional fastpitch pitching school held at Claude D. Taylor Elementary School (1996, 1997, 1998), helping young athletes improve during the off season.
- Named Coach of the Year by Softball New Brunswick (1997).
- Wrote a bi-weekly sports column for the Albert County Chronicle, providing commentary on sport trends, featuring the achievements of local athletic youth (1997-1999).
- Coached local athlete Janiva Willis, who went on to become a member of the Canadian Women's National Softball team.
- Became one of the few Level 3 softball coaches in Canada (2000) certified by the National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP), which allows coaches to work at the international level.
