



Why is the garbage collection schedule changing?

The Town of Riverview has awarded a new tender for this service. With the rising cost of inflation, we were able to work collaboratively with the City of Dieppe to allow the contractor (Miller Waste Systems) to work more efficiently - resulting in cost savings to both municipalities while maintaining a high level of service for residents.

How is the schedule changing?

Weekly garbage collection will now be consolidated into two days per week (previously four). All garbage collection in Riverview will take place weekly on Mondays and Tuesdays. There will also be a change to the bulky waste collection from twice per year, to bi-weekly. Instead of bi-annually, you will now be able to include one bulky item every second week alongside your clear garbage.

Is there a change to the amount or type of garbage picked up at the curb?

The collection schedule type (Blue, Clear, Green) will continue without change. You can view this schedule at www.eco360.ca/residential program. The sorting guide will continue to be mailed to every civic address as in the past.

When does the new schedule take effect?

The new twice per week schedule begins on July 1 (July 4 & 5 garbage days).

How will residents be notified of the changes?

Residents will be notified through mailers to all civic addresses, the Town of Riverview website, waste and recycling email notifications, social media accounts and local news coverage.

What happens if my collection day falls on a holiday Monday?

Waste will still be collected on holiday Mondays, with the exception of Christmas Day if falling on a Monday.

What qualifies as a 'bulky item'?

One item can be placed at the curb on regular clear collection day, starting July 11. Bulky items include but are not limited to - furniture, appliances, and tree branches.

- Branches and tree limbs (no greater than 2.5 cm or 1 inch in diameter) must be securely bundled and no longer, taller or wider than 60 cm (2 feet).
- A bag must weigh less than 18 kg (40 lb)



- Household hazardous waste presents a danger to collectors and will not be picked up at the curb. This includes batteries, cooking oil, aerosols, paint, light bulbs, fertilizers, chemicals, CFL bulbs, propane tanks, etc.

How to I dispose of hazardous waste or multiple bulky items?

Eco360 accepts household hazardous waste, residential construction waste, appliances, furniture, tires and more through its Mobile Eco-Depot. The service is available on a weekly basis and rotates between all communities in the south-eastern region.

Residents can recycle glass at the permanent outdoor depot on Robertson Street next to the parking lot for Mill Creek Nature Park. For more information, visit www.eco360.ca or call 506-877-1040.
